ARRA Weatherization Assistance Project

CAP Services received a contract to weatherize 379 low-income homes (July, 2009-June, 2010), 172 of which are ARRA units. Overall, the Weatherization Assistance Program operators in Wisconsin have production goals as follows for the July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010 period. Some will over-produce and those costs will be funded by additional funds available from both ARRA and traditional weatherization program fund sources.

Homeowners might experience as much as 25% savings in their energy bills once their homes are weatherized. Energy savings are achieved by: installing attic, wall, crawl space, water heater and hot water pipe insulation; sealing air leaks into the home; and, installing low-flow shower heads and energy-efficient light bulbs in every home. Based upon the projected energy savings, furnaces, refrigerators and freezers may also be replaced.
